Dear Parents / Guardians

I have some very exciting news about a program which our school will be involved in this year. We are one of 40 schools throughout the state to participate in the Building Healthy Communities (BHC) program! It was developed and is coordinated by the Wayne State University Center for School Health, and primary funding comes from Blue Cross Blue Shield of Michigan and the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services. Here are ways our students (and teachers) will benefit:

- All teachers will receive a BHC Program Guide based on the USDA Myplate Dietary guidelines and a comprehensive list of physical activity breaks. Be on the lookout for Parent Tip Sheets and Healthy Homework which be sent home with each nutrition lesson.
- Our Physical Education (PE) teacher will participate in professional development and receive a nationally-recognized curriculum AND lots of new high-quality PE equipment to use.
- We will receive a large rolling cart packed with fun equipment to help get students moving during recess. Physical activity improves academic performance, and recess is a great time for students to work toward the goal of being active at least 60 minutes daily.
- There will be school-wide activities throughout the year which will offer families a chance to be physically active and/or try new healthy food together. The Student Leadership Team will be planning these events as well as evaluating our school policies on health and wellness.



<u>Fuel Up To Play 60</u> Students will be making changes at school to create more opportunities to eat healthy and be physically active for 60 minutes every day

We will also have a Healthy Kids Club after-school which will offer non-competitive physical activities, serve a healthy snack and review daily health messages.

As principal, I will be promoting a Healthy Tip of the Day announcement and periodic newsletters to encourage students to choose healthy foods and increase physical activity.

Please support what students are leaning at school by offering healthy choices at home and being physically active with your children as much as possible.
