Laughter can increase pain tolerance and improve immune function, making it beneficial for overall health.




From the Office:

Dear Parents/Guardians:

Hand Foot and Mouth Disease (HFMD) (known as Coxsackievirus) is impacting kids in our school. Here is some information from the Benzie-Leelanau District Health Department on this common viral infection in children.

How long before my child shows symptoms?

3-6 days after exposure

What are the symptoms? Raised rash, particularly on palms, soles and

area surrounding mouth. Progresses to blisters, then scabs. Also causes sores inside mouth,

making swallowing painful.

How does my child get exposed? Direct contact with an infected person's

respiratory secretions; may be found in feces (poop) for up to one month after symptoms resolve. Because this disease may be contracted through contact with feces, good

handwashing is a must!

How long can my child be contagious? Virus is found in the stool while sores are

present and for about a month after they

disappear. Oral secretions are infectious while

sores are present.

How can I control the spread of HFMD? Reinforce good hand hygiene. Exclusion is

recommended if the child has blisters in their mouth and drool, or has weeping lesions on their

hands, or are too ill to participate.

Other Wash and disinfect/sanitize surfaces (counter

tops, handles, doorknobs) multiple times per day, discard articles soiled with nose, throat, or fecal discharge. **Give careful attention to hand**

washing after touching nose, mouth, bathroom use, and before eating.

If you are concerned that your child has this condition, please see your family doctor so that a diagnosis can be made, and treatment can be given. Children with HFMD will be excluded from school until lesions are free of discharge, and student is well enough to participate. The school nurse can be contacted at 419-671-8756 to assist you if you have any questions or concerns.
