

November SNAP Benefit Delay and Food Support Resources

What's Happening to SNAP Benefits?

Due to the federal government shutdown, there may be a delay in receiving benefits for anyone enrolled in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP). The federal Food and Nutrition Service (FNS) has directed the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) to hold November SNAP benefits until further notice.
