Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2015-16 educational progress for the Benzie Central Middle School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. Students educated at Benzie Central Middle School (BCMS) are improving at or above state levels in core curricular areas. The State of Michigan has identified some schools with the status of Reward, Focus or Priority. A Reward school is one that is outperforming other schools in achievement, growth, or is performing better than other schools with a similar student population. A Focus school is one that has a large achievement gap in 30% of its student achievement scores. A Priority school is one whose achievement and growth is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. Our school has been identified as a Focus School.

In the past we have looked at both our MEAP (M-STEP) and NWEA data in the areas of Reading and Math. These are the subject areas where we identified the greatest struggle for incoming students. While we are pleased to have made continues improvement in all core subject areas we continue to refine our teaching practices and instructional delivery for students based on the prior educational experience. Our staff is dedicated to improving their skills and growing as professionals so current and future students that require remediation and differentiate learning have demonstrated growth or development based on skills entering BCMS. In the school year 2013-2014 BCMS became a focus school. The identification is a cycle that occurs for 3 years and is the results of our school disparity between our top 30% and our bottom 30%. As a result our building has shifted our attention to our tier two interventions increasing the robust support that students need coming from the elementary. Michigan Department of Education in 2014-2015 school year, has shift the state assessment from MEAP to M-STEP which is testing in the spring which will give our staff a better picture of growth while in the middle school. This will help support the high academic level of education provided at Benzie Central Middle School (BCMS).

State law requires that we also report additional information.

Assigning Pupils Students who live within the designated school boundaries are able to attend Benzie Central Middle School. Additionally, parents may complete forms for In-District Schools of Choice if they reside within the Benzie Central Schools boundaries. For families who are not residents of Benzie Central Schools, they may apply for Out of District Schools of Choice. Please contact David Clasen, Principal for assistance.

School Improvement Benzie Central Middle School continues to implement its School Improvement Plan focusing on improving student performance in the areas of Reading, and Math. Professional development and strategy instruction is targeted to improve these areas. The state of Michigan requires each public school building to examine daily operations, procedures, educational practices, and habits that go along with teaching children. Specifically, schools are required to demonstrate a level of proficiency (based on a rating scale) in the major strands of Teaching for Learning, Leadership for Learning, Professional Learning Culture, and School, Family, and Community Relations. These strands represent the Michigan School Systems Review. BCMS staff provide input to assess this improvement framework. Effectiveness of program and practice, compiled data sources to document achievement, and action items for on-going improvement are looked at and discussed. Through this process rubric rating scores are derived. given the opportunity to complete an online survey of relative data.

BCMS Mission Statement:

We challenge all students to Excel, Academically, Artistically, Emotionally, Physically, and Socially in a Safe Supportive Environment.

Specialized Schools: Specialized Schools Benzie Central Middle School provides services to physically, emotionally or cognitively handicapped students locally when possible or through the Traverse Bay Area Intermediate School District when the student's condition precludes attendance at our school.

Core Curriculum: Curriculum is developed and implemented based on the Common Core State Standards (CCSS). For a copy of the core curriculum, go to the Benzie Central Schools website at www.benzieschools.net or request a copy from the Middle School office.

Standardized Assessment: Over the past four school years, students at Benzie Central Middle School have taken NWEA assessments. 7th grade scores in both Math and Reading, while at the national average, have increased from last year to our most recent proctoring. 8th grade scores remain above the national average across all years.

Parent Participation

Volunteers are always welcome and accepted as part of the fabric of Benzie Central Middle School. Our group of volunteers includes parents, senior citizens and high school students. Primarily our volunteers served as chaperones on field trips, support in the Advisory Class, working one-to-one or with small groups of students during the school day or after school hours. Every parent is invited to participate in Parent Teacher Conferences (PTC). These events occur once in the fall each school year. Appointments are available anytime however our PTC are located in the gym and are available to everyone. Our system uses years of research developing the most efficient time for parents and teachers to meet. Conferences are scheduled in the afternoon and evening hours so as to offer best opportunities for participation.

The 2016 - 17 school year saw ?% of our eighth (8th) grade parents and ?% of our seventh (7th) grade parents represented at the Fall Conferences. (2015-16 = 49% 8th and 61% = 7th). In addition to the fall conferences parents came to witness student activity and performance in large numbers for the Open House, winter and spring Band and Choir concerts/Festivals, as well as various BCMS sporting events (Football, Volleyball, Soccer, Basketball, Wrestling and Track & Field). Parents also choose to lead children in some very useful school-based activities. Each year we have parents lead Odyssey of the Mind (OM) teams. These groups meet regularly from November through early March to work toward solving a problem team-style. These groups meet after school hours and on weekends.
