Student Council Report: Student Council member, Thea Gray, shared a student council update. Homecoming week is the week of October 15-19. The theme this year is board games; Seniors Candy Land, Juniors Monopoly, Sophomores Life, and Freshmen Jumanji. Administration Report:

- A. NMSLA Update Superintendent Olson shared that it is quiet in Lansing; paying close attention to lame duck in session in terms of power shift and balance.
- B. Lake Ann Presentation-Mr. Milne presented first on cross-country, sharing that there were 44 Husky pups that participated in the program. He also touched on Delta Math and Readers Theater. Third and fourth grade students from his class demonstrated their math project work and read a story that they have been working on in Readers Theater.
- C. 2017-18 Audit Review: Dennis, Gartland, & Niergarth/Julie Burks, CPA-The results of the 2017-18 Benzie Central School District's Financial Audit were presented by Julie Burks, CPA, from Dennis, Gartland, and Niergarth. The formal audit of district's financial statements resulted in \$14,460.487 of revenue and

\$13,700,508 of expenditures. This resulted in the addition of 759,979 to the fund balance, increasing the district's June 30, 2017 fund balance to \$1,512,831 or (11.04%.)

D. MSTEP Presentation-Superintendent Olson shared big picture comparisons comparing that of Benzie Central to the State of Michigan as well as schools of similar demographics. The performance and progress summary graphs reflect data that Benzie Central continues to outpace state and schools of similar demographics. Mr. Olson shared that proficiency levels across the state are well below expectations, and that work will always have to be done, as the stakes are getting higher, particularly in 3rd grade.

- A. Platte River Task Force Resolution The Platte River Community Center Task group proposes that the Benzie central School Board adopt the strategic plan of the task group. The strategic plan is as follows: The mission is that the center provides space and support for organizations and individuals. It will be operated in a sustainable manner. The vision is that the center attracts people of all ages and abilities leading to a healthy thriving community. The task group will attempt to have a solid group of entities establish operations at the center within 18 months of the signing of this proposal. The idea is to get strong participation at the center one entity (organization, and/or individual) at a time. The task group will initially focus on attracting 2-3 larger organizations as "anchor" tenants at the facility.
- B. Resolution of Support County School Resource Officer Millage The Benzie County Central Board of Education recognizes the immense responsibility of maintaining the safety of students in our charge. Representatives of Benzie County inclusive of law enforcement, school officials, and county officials have recommended to the Benzie County Board of Commissioners to place a question before the voters to support one school resource officer at each county district (Benzie Central and Frankfort-Elberta.) Approval of the millage would result in the placement of a School Resource Officer at the Benzie Central Middle/High School in a full time capacity to serve as a critical resource for our students and staff as well as being a constant presence for the security and safety of our community. The officer would also be visible in elementary buildings when needed. The board of education will have a role in the interview process as well as the job description.
