Welcome Back Husky Students and Families! We are so excited to see all your smiling faces!

This school year, we will be exploring and developing habits that support leadership qualities in <u>all</u> our students. Rather than seeing children through the lens of a normal bell curve, where some children are naturally gifted in an area and others are not, this way of seeing views every child as capable, every child as a leader. Viewing children in this way changes the way they see themselves. When children change the way they see themselves, the way they see everything changes.

Through the course of the school year, we will be discovering 7 habits and create a culture that inspires growth and development based on the idea that every child can be a leader.

- Habits 1-3 help each student become the best version of themselves; being in charge of themselves, making a plan for success, and prioritizing.
- Habits 4-6 emphasize habits that address working well with others considering the needs of others, understanding others, and the power of working together.
- Habit 7 makes sure we take time to take care of ourselves so that we bring our best selves to everything we do.

As with building every strong and stable structure, laying a solid foundation comes first. During September we will be setting that foundation by discovering and developing habits, principles, and paradigms.

- Habits a habit is something we do so often that we don't even have to think about it. Habits are an important part of taking care of ourselves.
 - Some helpful habits at school raising hands, turning in papers, bathroom procedures, working in groups, fire drills, and hallway and cafeteria behavior.
 - Some helpful habits at home cleaning our own mess, brushing our teeth, saying please and thank you, and packing our own backpack.
- Paradigms a paradigm is the way you see something. It is your point of view. Think of an elephant as experienced by six blindfolded people each approaching it from a different direction.



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- Principles a principal is always there, even though we can't see it. Gravity is a principle. Honesty is a principle too.
 - Some examples of important personal principles include honesty, grit, determination, teamwork, respect, responsibility, and kindness.
