**Mission Statement:** The mission of the Lake Ann Elementary School is to create a positive, safe, and caring environment that promotes high levels of academic performance, builds personal responsibility, develops cooperation and fosters an appreciation of learning within members of our school community.



Dear Parents.

Even in the cold winter months, we believe outdoor recess is an important and valuable part of the student's day. With that in mind, we ask that you consider the temperature and weather conditions when assisting your child with clothing for the day. There may be times when the weather is deemed too cold for outdoor recess. We make that determination on a daily basis, but please remember that on most days we will have outdoor recess even if it is for an abbreviated time.

All students go outside unless they have a doctor's note stating otherwise. All students go outside for recess unless it is colder than 0 degrees (actual or wind chill).

Every child is required to wear five items of winter gear for recess:

1. Gloves/mittens 2. Winter hat 3. Winter coat 4. Snow pants 5. Snow boots

If students do not have all 5 items they will still be allowed to go outside for the 15 minute recess, but will not be allowed to play on the equipment or in the snow. This is NOT to punish the students for not having all their gear. This is to prevent them from getting their clothes wet and having to sit in cold wet clothes all day. They will stand by the building wall which keeps them out of the wind. They will still be allowed to socialize with their peers. We will obviously not send students out without a coat or hat. We have unclaimed items in the lost and found and donated items that they can borrow.

We do not have enough staff to offer outside and inside recess to students. **Also, this is a DISTRICT WIDE Requirement at all 3 elementary buildings.** It is not something that just happens at Lake Ann. It is a rule at all schools in the district and has been for a number of years.

We realize that temperatures in our buildings may vary, so dressing in layers is a good practice. In addition, *please label coats, gloves, hats, scarves, etc.* as these items of clothing go missing. Take the time to check out the Lost and Found, as we have a large number of items at this time of year.

If you have any comments or concerns about these guidelines, please call the principal to discuss it – rather than posting it on social media. We are a very kind-hearted and passionate team of individuals and we are happy to sit with you at any time to discuss any concerns you may have. Thank you for your attention and continued support and stay warm!

Dear Families -

Our thoughts and prayers are with the students, staff, and families in Oxford, Michigan today as their community faced a school shooting yesterday. Violence in school has been a National issue for the past few decades. I want you to know that safety and security is a priority at Benzie Central Schools. We take a number of proactive measures to ensure all students and staff are as safe as possible each day.

We require all students and staff to follow all security procedures at school at all times; use designated doors to enter the school, do not open doors for others, even for people you may know and do not prop open doors. We continue to conduct practice drills, in conjunction with our local law enforcement officers, to ensure everyone understands how to respond during a crisis.

*In addition to practicing procedures, we also encourage students to do the following:* 

We need students to speak up and say something if they see a concern. Their voice is an important resource we use to foster school safety and know about potential situations.

Students can always report a concern to ANY school staff through a face-to-face meeting, email, or a phone call. Our adults are all here to support and we take all reports seriously.

Reports can be made confidentially through OK2SAY (text 652729 or call 8-555-OK2SAY). These reports do come to us and we investigate each one thoroughly.

Students should not make jokes (in person or online) about school violence. Making references to school shootings, mimicking, copycats, and such comments (in person or online) are not tolerated and will face potential disciplinary consequences.

We work closely with our local law enforcement both to ensure our campus is secure and when investigating any potential threats to our community.

We are all living in challenging times. Please know that we are here to support your students' academic, social, and emotional needs. If your child would like to speak to a counselor, please contact your child's school office so they can reach out to your child.
