Responsibility Centered Discipline (RCD): supporting students in behavior ownership


Students come to school to learn a variety of skills and behaviors that will hopefully lend nicely to their current state and also to their future capabilities as they grow and learn to be productive citizens. With this, will inevitably also come set backs and opportunities to learn and grow even more and to take responsibility for themselves as well.

This is where our new District and building initiative Responsibility Centered Discipline (RCD) is helping to shape student agency within Benzie.

Traditionally speaking, the adult does a lot of what founder Larry Thompson calls the "heavy lifting" when it comes to traditional student discipline. The adult hears of the offense, the adult investigates, the adult comes up with a consequence. What was missing in this model is the opportunity for student learning, the opportunity for restorative measures, and the opportunity for the student to create a plan for themselves to hopefully keep them from making the same mistake again.

June 2023, and again at the beginning of our 23-24 school year, RCD founder Larry Thompson came to Benzie School District to train staff in this responsibility approach.

A large part of this approach is using the 'give em' five conversation". This portion runs on a checklist of necessary components for a successful conversation between staff and students such as: keep it private, model & encourage good listening, keep safety in mind, maintain a non-threatening

position and tone, being aware of your voice, posture and words, stay out of power struggles, praise and encourage as behavior improves, restart the conversation if needed, provide space and time if needed.

These conversations use the hand pictured above to help guide the conversation between staff and students. The elements of these conversations consist of providing coaching and conversation around: Support ("I am here to help you be successful"), Expectation (what Foundation or expectation was broken?), Breakdown (what action prevented the Expectation from being followed?), Benefit (why is it in the student's best interest to follow this Expectation?) and Closure (is the student able to create, accept their plan, and move on?).

RCD is a Tier 1 behavior support measure we will continue to use and perfect throughout this school year and beyond to help best support our students' learning and growth!
